Absolutely fantastic conditions for the 2021 Dragon Force 65 Queensland State Championships hosted by Paradise Radio Yacht Club at Emerald Lakes, Gold Coast on Sunday 3 October 2021. Sunny and 26 Degrees with a cool North Westerly made for the perfect stage for a great day.



Because of the large fleet the PRO used a two heat four boat promotion fleet management system (HMS).



Story of the Dragon Force 65 Queensland State Champion Bindawalla Perpetual Trophy.

A silver-plated platter named the "Bindawalla Perpetual Trophy" was donated by the



Jefferys Family.

The Trophy is to be held each year by the current Queensland Dragon Force 65 State Champion and then passed onto the next year's winner.

The name "Bindawalla" is aboriginal for happy home and "represents those values important to us all" (family quote). It was the name of the Jefferys Family boat which they raced successfully and then cruised to the Barrier Reef for a number of years.

Given that most Dragon Force RC skippers have had a lifelong involvement with yacht racing, this trophy reflects that history and is a fitting annual award. It will record event winners from the very first year of official Queensland Dragon Force Championship competition.

Thirty skippers from six separate clubs registered to try to take the Bindawalla Silver Perpetual State DF65 champion trophy \(\sqrt{2} \) back home.

The Perpetual Trophy wasn't on show this year due to its location in lockdown NSW because of Covid.





Strong shifty blustery conditions

Conditions were extremely testing with the cool north-westerly breeze challenging competitors as it shifted in direction and varied from 5 to 15 knots (gusting 20 knots). Competitors were on edge with adrenaline kicking in and knees shaking as they all lined up on the blustery start line. All desperately trying to keep a clear position to get out of the gate cleanly and get to the top mark without any collisions. Changing conditions meant rig selection was critical with "mental games" being played as competitors strategized, watched, looked and changed rigs. "A tight main foot and powered up jib were absolutely key to performance in the choppy windy conditions" competitors said as some shared settings to help each other.

"If you put yourself in the right place and you had the right settings you did well ". Predicting the setup for each race was the key factor for success on this racecourse. Combined with of course having a clean start, clean air and minimal contacts with other boats during the race put you in a great position to do well on the day.


"This was great fun and a great experience to mix it with some of the best sailors in Australia. It's not often you have 30 competitive boats racing in such challenging conditions. A real learning curve for all competitors." remarked Dean Horton.

Whilst first places were shared between 4 skippers, more important was the fact that the first five places of each race were shared between the top 15 boats. A testament to how close this racing was. Also having the 2 fleets racing allowed for new members in the sport to enjoy some very close racing.

Noteworthy performances on the day included Andrew Wilson and John Gower both picking up two firsts and Graham Cowling who also got a win. Big named competitor namely Greg Torpy (ex. world Etchell champion and Olympian and 2021 IOM Queensland state title holder) was also up there from time to time. Finally, Mike Jefferys with 9 firsts to enable him to again take home the Bindawalla trophy for another year.

We were also blessed with two father and son teams. Well done Scott and Gary Rudd from PRYC and Dean and Don Horton who sail DF65's out of the newly formed Redland Bay Yacht club. Don mentioned "the racing, sportsmanship and organization were first class". Dean ended up with a very respectable 4th place. Dean has a very impressive resume as a junior winning Sabo and 420 Queensland State Titles, placing in the world youth sailing champion, and a big boat match racing champion and Brisbane to Gladstone winner.

Also, the Luck brothers had some fun in the sun under their umbrella which looked like taking off a few times.
